## **Governors Ethos Committee Achievements 2022/2023**

During the past year, the Ethos Committee strengthened its knowledge of the federation schools through rigorous monitoring and evaluating the impact of the schools' distinctive Christian character and values, ensuring these underpin all aspects of school life and are made clear in all public communications. The committee reviewed termly values and led on the development of the Federation Vision. The following monitoring activities undertaken were all driven by priorities identified in the Federation Development Plan. Members of the committee:

- checked that daily collective worship reflects our Christian character; Christian Values and Vision being
  central to the daily life of both schools with opportunities provided to develop children's understanding
  of prayer and different types of prayer,
- focused on monitoring progress against previous SIAMS Inspection priorities,
- reviewed links with British Values and the impact of these,
- met with RE subject leads and talked to children to find out more about the RE Curriculum where children's understanding of Christianity within a wider global society is encouraged and promoted with visible links made to courageous advocacy.

This monitoring has given the committee confidence to ask questions, check policies are reflected in practice and ensure the schools are fulfilling statutory responsibilities.

A Foundation governor for each church sits on the Ethos committee allowing links with the churches to be further strengthened for both schools.

# **Governor Update**

Last term the Full Governing Body met on 5<sup>th</sup> December. A range of topics were included on the agenda, and Governors identified the headlines from the meeting as follows:

- Academisation As part of the Government's target to increase the proportion of schools which are part of strong Academy Trusts, governors are in the very early stages of exploring what academisation might mean for our schools. There is a plan to hear more from different trusts in the area as to what they provide so that, when the time is right for us, we have the information available to us to progress this further.
- Self Evaluation Form (SEF) the "Behaviour and Attitudes" section of the SEF was reviewed by Governors and further evidence added.
- Schools Financial Value Standard (SFVS) this is a self-assessment tool to evidence the effective financial management of school resources. This has been completed and thoroughly reviewed for both schools.
- Succession planning Clare Hares was appointed as a Staff Co-opted Governor and Adrian Gilby joins the Board as an Associate Member.
- Equality Objectives Governors received an update on progress towards achieving the Equality Objectives.
