Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope that you have had a wonderful half-term break.

### Reading

Please continue to read with your children at least 5 times a week. Reading books will continue to be changed on Mondays. This can include school books and other reading material such as comics, books from the library/home, magazines, etc. Regular practice is an important component of your child's reading journey.

### Library

The children are enjoying our weekly visits to the library and have access to a range of books. Please remind your children to return these books every Monday.

### Homework and Spelling

A reminder of the homework expectations in Robin class:

- Read 5 times a week
- Access the White Rose 1 minute maths at least 3 times a week (<https://whiterosemaths.com/1-minute-maths>). This can be downloaded for free on a phone/tablet.
- Spelling – a spelling list will be sent home at the end of this week. Please choose 3 spellings from each week's column and include each one in a different sentence – there should be 3 sentences in total. Remember to underline the word that you have included in the sentence. Spellings will be tested every Friday.

### PE

This term PE will be on Mondays and Thursdays. Please ensure your child wears suitable PE kit to school on these days: black or navy shorts, school PE T-shirt, socks and trainers.

**Please ensure all belongings are clearly marked with your child's name. We have a large amount of unmarked lost property at the end of each day and would like these items to be returned to children where possible.**
