Welcome back to you all. We hope you had a lovely break.

Enquiry based learning – What makes a good show?

This term we are introducing the Curious City approach to enquiry-based learning, this is followed by the rest of the school and interweaves skills and knowledge to investigate and answer a question.

Wren Class are going to find out 'What makes a good show'. We are going to find out why Hawkesbury Show is so important to the village and what we would expect to see there. We will work on this throughout the term culminating in holding our own mini version of the show on the afternoon of Wednesday 10th July at 2.30pm. We hope you will be able to attend.

If you or a member of your family have a skill (e.g. knitting, baking, photography etc.) you would like to share with us and enable us to produce an 'entry' for our own show then please get in touch.

Phonics and reading

Daily phonics lessons will continue throughout this term. We are consolidating our knowledge of Phase 4, including adjacent consonants (such as tr, str, mp, gr, sp, bl) and two syllable words. We recommend that the children continue to practise their letter formation, trickier phonemes and words as much as possible to support their learning at school. Likewise, please continue to read as much as possible at home, this really does make a difference to their reading confidence. Ideally each book your child receives should be read at least three times to encourage fluency and confidence. Decoding and sharing books will continue to be changed every Friday and library books will be changed every Wednesday.

Mathematics

As well as deepening our understanding of key skills we will be focusing on sharing and grouping, visualise, build and map, make connections and then consolidation time. Throughout the term we will be applying these skills and consolidating our understanding of these concepts through problem solving. We are sending home some maths activities to help your child be ready for Year 1, please look out for these in your child's bookbag. Maths games will continue to be changed every Tuesday, thank you to Mrs Giles for your support with this.

PSHE lessons

This term our theme is 'Changing Me'. This will provide the children with basic terminology of body parts, understand that they have grown and are continuing to grow since they were a baby, and address any worries that they may have as they move to Year 1. The grid below summarises the structure of the lessons this term.
