KS2 Achievement, 2024-2025

Schools are required to publish their latest KS2 assessment information.

The first table shows the proportion of children who achieved the expected standard and a higher level of attainment for all subject areas combined.

KS2	Percentage of pupils
Proportion of children who achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and maths combined	62%
Proportion of children achieved the higher standard in reading, writing and maths combined	15%

The second table shows the progress scores for the cohort as a whole. The average is 0 and measures are calculated based on the score each child achieved at KS1 (Year 2) and compared to other children across the country who achieved a similar score at KS1.

Reading	It will not be possible to calculate key stage 1 to key stage 2 progress measures for 2023 to 2024 or 2024 to 2025 academic years. This is because there is no key stage 1 baseline available to calculate primary progress measures for these years, because of Covid disruption.

The third table shows the average scaled score for the cohort. Children must achieve a scaled score of 100 to pass the test and an average of 110 to achieve a higher level.
