TERM 1 NEWSLETTER

Dear parents,

We hope that you have had a wonderful summer and that you are refreshed and ready for the new school year.

TEACHERS AND TEACHING ASSISTANTS

Our teaching team remains unchanged, with Mrs Tilsley now taking the class on Wednesday and Mr Riddington teaching the children for the rest of the week. We are delighted that Mrs Baxter and Mrs Choyce will also have time with the class to support children with their learning.

NEW TO HAWKS?

Routines are very similar to those in Swallow class.

- **COMING TO SCHOOL.** Children enter the school by the corridor doors closest to the main school gate.
- **PEGS.** These are found in the corridor opposite the school library
- **START OF DAY.** On arrival in the classroom, pupils will need to get their reading books, rulers and either a pencil or pen so that we are ready for the day ahead.
- **PENCIL CASES.** Pupils are allowed to bring in their own pencil cases. However, they do not need to do so as the school will provide the necessary materials to carry out the tasks set. Pencil cases must be small enough to fit into the child's tray and should not be a distraction during lessons.
- **BREAK AND LUNCH.** Times will remain the same as last year.
- **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.** Children will have the opportunity to stand for election as a house captain and vice-captain as well as a school councillor. Positions as members of the library and worship team will also be available. Year 6 children will have a buddy in Wren class.

ENQUIRY

The first enquiry is called 'How do we all live together?' As historians, children will learn about the Ancient Greeks and democracy.

As artists, we will initially focus on drawing, starting with 3D shapes before moving on to sketching animals. This will then develop into drawing mythological monsters.

We will be joined by Madame Fuller on Thursday mornings for our French lessons.

HOMEWORK

We will be providing our pupils with homework books for English and Maths. They will be asked to do work from these books and bring them in – together with their home reading record - on Thursday morning.

In addition to the work in the homework books, we ask that children do the following:

- **TIMES TABLES** – Being fluent in times tables facts is crucial in Hawk class. So much of what we learn requires a good knowledge of times table facts. Regular practice at home is strongly recommended if multiplication facts are not secure. If your child is not fluent, regular daily practice is encouraged.
- **SPELLINGS**. We will continue to send home spelling sheets that will need to be practised at home each term.
- **READING**. Most children in Years 5 and 6 are able to read independently, but please do not leave them to it all the time! Research has shown that children who continue to have parental support with reading and comprehension can make better rates of progress. Please continue to read to your children as well: they will benefit from hearing stories that may be too challenging for them to read at present. Reading to them will also broaden their vocabulary.

TIME FOR READING

As is the case with the other classes in the school, we like to celebrate the reading that takes place at home. To do this we need your help. The children will all be given a reading record in September which needs to be completed whenever they have a reading experience at home. Many parents may find it hard to write down a comment each time their child reads. Please do not worry about this. All we need is a date and a signature to show that your child has been reading. For every date that is signed and dated by you, your child can add to our reading wallchart and be celebrated for achieving the termly target.

P.E.

P.E. days will be Thursday and Monday this term. Children should come to school wearing their PE kits on these days.

ADVANCE WARNING: SCHOOL TRIP TO LONDON

On December 2nd, we will be visiting the Houses of Parliament in London. As we are travelling some distance away, we will need our children to be in school much earlier and will be returning home much later in the day. More details will be sent nearer the time.

SWIMMING

Swimming lessons begin on Monday 29th September and conclude on Monday 17th November. On 'swimming weeks' there is no need for children to come to school in games kit on Mondays.
