Welcome to our Term 4 newsletter. We hope you had a restful half term.

### Our Learning

This term we are focusing on knowing about how to keep healthy, we will be looking at the importance of...

- regular physical activity
- healthy eating
- toothbrushing
- sensible amounts of 'screen time'
- having a good sleep routine
- being a safe pedestrian

As authors we will be continuing to develop our simple sentence writing, remembering correct handwriting, writing on the line and finger spaces.

As scientists this term we will focus on understanding the effects of changing seasons on the natural world around us, this learning will also be part of our Forest school sessions.

In RE we will be recognising people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways. We will also be answering the question 'why do Christians put crosses in Easter gardens?'

As mathematicians we will be continuing to represent 6, 7 and 8, comparing length, height and time, and building numbers 9 and 10. We will continue with our Mastery of Number sessions as well.

### Thursday PE with Future Stars

Our PE lessons will once again be held on a Thursday and be led by our PE coach, Felix, from Future Stars. We will be focusing on ball skills. Please make sure your child comes in wearing trainers as PE will take place outside weather depending.

### Forest School

Our Forest School sessions will continue to be held on Monday afternoon so please make sure waterproofs and wellies are in school.

### Recognition Board and Values Tree

In line with our whole school behaviour policy, we have a 'Recognition Rocket' which the children enjoy putting their photographs on if they challenge themselves in their learning or show good learning behaviour.

We also promote our school values of **respect, perseverance, and creativity** by recognising children showing those values and celebrating them on our values tree.

The children enjoy talking about our values and regularly remind each other (and us) to keep persevering if they find something tricky!

#### Reading Diaries / Phoneme Cards and Common Exception Word Cards

Thank you to all our parents who listen to their child read regularly, it makes a big impact on their learning. Please could you indicate if you have listened to your child read, even if this is just a signature or a tick in the reading record book.

As we said in our phonics meeting, we have learnt all the new phonemes for Reception, however some of these are particularly tricky and need to be practised as much as possible. Please continue to practise the **phoneme cards** and **common exception word cards** regularly, particularly focusing on the digraphs and trigraphs: or, ar, ur, er, ure, air, ear. Encourage your child to recognise these phonemes in words when reading and spelling.
